Plan Your Future Pathway



University

Prerequisites:

- OSSD
- 6 U (University) level, or M (Mixed) level courses
- O (Open) courses not counted as part of a university's "Top 6" admission average

College

Prerequisites:

- OSSD
- U (University), M (Mixed), O (Open) level courses accepted



Course Selection (Gr. 12)

- Students in Grade 12 are required to take a minimum of **6 COURSES** including one **English course**
- However, it is recommended that students with only 24 credits (at the end of grade 11) take 7 courses minimum in grade 12
- In order to graduate with the OSSD, students must have a total of 30 credits (18 compulsory + 12 elective)
- Students require a minimum of six (6) Grade 12 University (4U) or University/College (4M) courses for admission to an Ontario university and college
- Students should check <https://www.ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca/> and <https://www.ontariocolleges.ca/en/> for the admissions requirements for specific programs at Ontario universities/colleges and choose courses accordingly
